The city received \$14,045.00 from FEMA for Derecho cleanup. The weekend of Aug. 28th a festival will be held in town in conjunction with Wheatland. More information will be coming. There has been a dog on the loose and council suggest residents call the Sheriff's dept. if they find it being a nuisance.
