Discussion on FY25 LOST funds. Library is in need of an upgrade and bids were presented for a new roof on the library building. Discussion was also held on the need for a new AC/heat mini split for inside the library. M/S, Jensen, Buckner to approve roof bid from West Branch roofing and move forward with mini split unit. All Ayes.

Spring clean up is scheduled for May 16th in conjunction with the school. Mike will make a list of needs from the city. Christi Miller asked for a donation from the city to help with the purchase of flowers. City will donate \$150 towards the purchase of flowers. All are welcome to join!

M/S, Resolution 2025-13; Setting a Public Hearing for the Annexation of property to the City. Meeting set for May 27, 2025. Roll Call, Griebel, Sprague, Jensen & Buckner. Reed absent.

Discussion on utility rate increases. Bid was presented by Republic to move recycling from the city to them. Discussion was held and the recycling services will stay with the city. M/S, Jensen, Buckner, to raise recycling rates to \$5.00/household beginning 10/1/2025 with a 4% rate increase every year after. All Aves.

Discussion on 2 nuisance abatement properties. Certified letters have been mailed with residents having 20 days to take action on their properties. City will move forward at that time as needed.

Discussion on assigning a 911 address for a new grain bin being built. M/S, Griebel, Jensen, to assign the address as 313 Clinton St. All Ayes.

M/S, Sprague, Gribel, for tax abatement permit. All Ayes.

M/S, Buckner, Sprague, to approve cigarette/tobacco permit for Calamus Country Store. All Ayes.

M/S, Sprague, Griebel for a golf permit for Michele Carle. All Ayes.

M/S, Buckner, Jensen for building permit for Steve Brown. M/S, Buckner, Jensen to approve permit, but needing to complete the permit more with measurements. Ayes, Buckner, Griebel, Buckner & Jensen. Nav. Sprague

M/S, Buckner, Jensen to approve building permit for Matthew Gronewold. Approval is based on the resident abiding by the 2' setback. All Ayes.

M/S, Griebel/Jensen to approve bid to sealcoat fitness center parking lot. Funds will come from LOST. All Ayes.

Discussion held on filling swimming pools within the city. No action was needed or taken.

Willits were present to discuss their charge of a 2nd water meter in their garage. The city bills per meter, not per property or lot. Discussion was held that the residents will have new water lines so they are only reading off of 1 meter and meter in the garage will be removed.

Mayor report: New street signs are beginning to be installed and looking good. Calamus RR depot may be looking at coming back to the City of Calamus. More information on that as the project moves forward.

PW Director presented a bid for the street work project. Will hire another person to help finish hanging new street signs and recycling pick-up.
